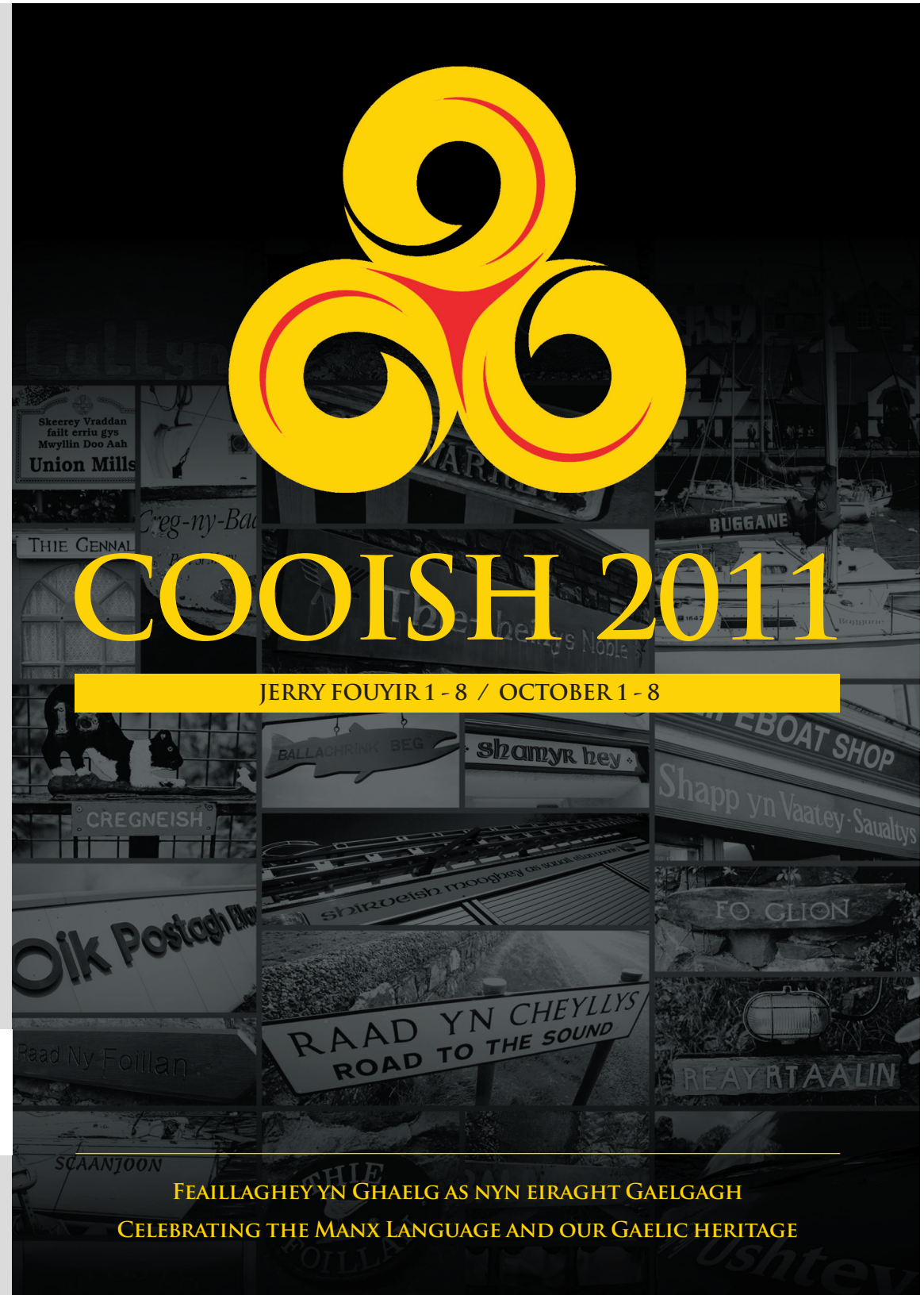

CHRIS MOSELEY

This year's Ned Maddrell Lecture will be delivered by Christopher Moseley, a teaching fellow in Latvian at the School of Slavonic and East European Studies at UCL. He is also the General Editor of the third edition of the UNESCO Atlas of World Languages in Danger.

The lecture is an excellent opportunity for us to find out more about the Atlas and the state of some of the world's minority languages; hopefully, Christopher's visit will also enable him to draw some lessons from the Island as to how UNESCO approach the categorisation for languages in danger.
